Nomination Criteria:

The recipient of the award should exemplify the following characteristics:

- Demonstrate dedication to the legacy of César Chávez and Dolores Huerta: Exemplify nonviolent philosophy in the struggle against injustice and the fight for peace and dignity in his or her community. Have a demonstrated willingness to sacrifice for the good of others.
- Demonstrate leadership in his or her community: Have a history of organizing that engages and empowers the community by motivating and mobilizing others toward an understanding of, and quest for, human rights and social justice for all people.
- Demonstrate a sustained commitment to service in their community: Advocate for social, economic and environmental justice through volunteer activism/organizing with the underprivileged and underrepresented.
